Graduation Requirements

Biblical Foundations Certificate

Students who satisfactorily complete the requirements associated with the four (4) courses in this program will earn a **Biblical Foundations Certificate** and 12 credit hours, which will be transferrable to the Associate Degree programs of Clarksville Theological College.

Biblical Studies Certificate

Students must complete all twelve (12) courses offered through the School of the Bible in order to graduate and earn a **Biblical Studies Certificate**. A student is considered to have earned credit for a course by his/her consistent attendance and the satisfactory completion of all course requirements. Graduates of the Clarksville School of the Bible may enroll in the Clarksville Theological College with 12 credit hours, which are transferrable to the Associate Degree programs.

Students who satisfactorily complete the requirements of either of these certificate programs will be invited to participate in the Clarksville Theological College & Seminary commencement exercises, and will be recognized and awarded a Certificate of Achievement from Clarksville School of the Bible.

The academic programs of Clarksville School of the Bible were designed to assist Sunday school teachers, assistant teachers, deacons, youth and teen ministry leaders, and others who desire to have a deeper understanding of the Word of God and to prepare or enhance their ability to serve the Lord.

Clarksville School of the Bible is open to adults of all ages as well as to High School students in the tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grades. There are no educational or academic prerequisites to enroll, however each enrolling student must agree with and sign the Clarksville Doctrinal Statement.

*Clarksville School of the Bible offers two certificate programs for our students to choose from; the **Biblical Foundations Certificate** and the **Biblical Studies Certificate**.*

The **Biblical Foundations Certificate** includes four Bible Survey courses, which are completed at the student's own pace and in the comfort of their home. (Off-campus self-paced courses)

The **Biblical Studies Certificate** includes a four-semester, twelve-course academic program held on Monday evenings from 6:30 pm to 9:05 pm on the College campus. Each semester of the academic program offers three (3) forty-five minute courses. (On-campus instructor led courses)
